Dannielle deeply impressed the council with her strong understanding of the role and her excellent administrative skills. To ensure a smooth transition, the council has been focused on providing Dannielle with the best possible support, including acquiring a new laptop, setting up her official .gov.uk email address, and formalising key HR policies. We know you will all join us in making her feel very welcome.

## **Charting Our Future: The Neighbourhood Development Plan**

September saw a major milestone for our Neighbourhood Development Plan, with the team delivering a splendid presentation to the community in the village hall. It was fantastic to see such a great turnout and an incredibly engaged audience. The team's hard work and excellent research were on full display, and the presentation was a clear success.

The group has been diligently engaging with landowners, and the council was thrilled to hear about some very positive opportunities for the future of our area. This project is a crucial step in ensuring our village's growth is shaped by the needs and desires of its residents. We will continue to provide updates as this vital work progresses. We are especially keen to engage with parishioners who didn't make it to this meeting and we will be organising a webinar to extend our reach.

### **Key Updates from the September Council Meeting**

The council's September meeting covered a wide range of topics, reflecting the dedicated work being done behind the scenes.

Financial Health and Governance: Our financial position remains steady. Councillors reviewed the mid-year budget and were pleased to note significant savings across several areas. The council formally approved revisions to the budget, which now includes the recent Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money we received from new developments. Additionally, the updated Risk and Asset Registers were approved, ensuring our governance remains robust and transparent. **Village Improvements**: We are continuing to work on visible improvements to our village green, starting with our new picnic bench. The council will be approaching the Chippenham and Villages Area Board to fund a package of improvements, including

the fencing, ground levelling, and tree stump removal. We also formally accepted the new picnic table and bench as recompense for a previous issue with the supply of the non-wheelchair accessible bench.

Highways and Footpaths: Traffic calming remains a high priority following worries expressed by our community. The council will be consulting the Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group (LHFIG) on both short-term and long-term measures. In other good news, the council has created a new document to record and plan for the maintenance of flood sites, moving to a more proactive approach to managing our local environment.

Projects and Assets: The council approved a new Biodiversity Policy, which will guide our actions to support local wildlife. A formal request has been made to obtain quotations for repointing the churchyard wall, a project that will be led by Cllrs Richard Anderson and Anthony Slater. This meeting also saw the formal approval of new areas of responsibility for councillors to ensure all village assets and issues are properly managed.

We would like to extend our thanks to everyone who has offered support and contributed feedback. Your involvement is what makes our council's work so rewarding and effective.
